Meet our Missionary Team!

We were so blessed to bring a team of 11 people to Africa, including three girls 6, 8 and 11.

The photo shows the entire team. The church bible study women gave us all gifts of matching dresses and shirts. This picture was taken before we went to experience the Kenyan Baptist Church.





Dan Hansen, a master electrician, attends Waterford Community Church. He taught CPR to the men during our trip. The men were amazed with the knowledge and were very excited to have it. We are hoping to teach the class again in January 2026.

All the 8 CPR dummies were donated by Parshall/Plaza Ambulance Service and Ken Rensch from Ambulance Resources in North Dakota. Dan made up posters that we laminated and hung all over the Church and School for future use. The posters were made in English and Swahili.

Justin Miller (sitting on bench, photo right) is a college professor and taught first aid to the men in the village. They had a lot of questions on what to do about snake bites, seizures, and every day scrapes and bruises. Justin also attends Waterford Community Church.

Angionette Hansen is a member at Waterford Community Church. She taught the women in the village about women's health, hygiene, and menstrual cycles. She also showed them how to use menstrual cloth kits.

She raised over \$1,000 to be able to buy menstrual kits for the women in the class and for future women who are in need.

Dr. Therese Miller is a member at Waterford Community Church. She taught the women in the village about "Self Care". She used a lacross ball to losen up tight muscles & much more. The women loved the "massage' feeling!



Jennifer Loew, a Changing A Destiny Board Member, came up with the idea of washing women's feet as a way to demonstrate the humble love and selflessness of Christ.

Jesus washed his disciples feet just before the Last Supper. The women were amazed by the loving act of service they received.

Dr. Theresa and Justin Miller were missing for a few hours and we found them washing dishes with the cooks. It took them 2 1/2 hours to wash dishes for 90 children. Imagine doing that twice a day bending over washing dishes! The Millers graciously agreed to donate funds for a dishwashing table - so no more bending over to wash dishes.

Surprise Mattress Delivery

A special donor, Becca Hines, donated \$200.00 to buy mattress for a famiy in the village. The team from America carried the mattresses up a huge hill with the help from our night guard Philip. When we arrived at the top of the hill we asked Phillip if he knew where were the mattress were going? He said no. We then shared the good news the mattresses were for his home. He was so surprised and happy! His children had been sleeping on a dirt floor. The experience was a very emotional one.



The Story Behind the Birth of Changing A Destiny, by Kathy Kohl - Executive Director

The reason this mission is so close to my heart is because of a little boy I met in an orphanage in 2017. He was left in a trash bag alongside the road just after he was born. A stranger found the baby, took him to the hospital, and he eventually ended up in an orphanage.

I got to visit Raymond three times in the orphanage and really bonded with him. After returning home from my missions trip, my new friend, Nicole, went to visit Raymond for me. She sent me photos and videos so I could see that he was healthy.

After seeing a photo of Nicole and her husband Tom holding Raymond, God placed it on my heart to ask them to adopt Raymond. After asking my Bible study group to help me pray about asking them, one of the ladies said she would pay for the adoption fees if they agreed.

I was shocked. We all started to cry. God was opening doors! It was an answered prayer, and I now I just needed to ask them.

I asked Nicole and she said she would pray about it, but God had already put the idea in their hearts. They brought baby Raymond home in 2017. Here we are seven years later. I have been able to watch him grow up to be a healthy, happy boy. He loves his big sister, Gloria, and she's happy that God answered her prayers by giving her a baby brother.





Nicole and I would love to be able to help more children like Raymond. God has placed it on our hearts to build a church & school to help educate the future generation. We already raised enough funds to purchase 2 acres of land (completed April 2022), built a church (completed April 2023) & a three to eight classroom school (three classe rooms were completed January 2025), and feed children in one of the poorest counties in Kenya. Check out our YouTube channel for more updates. Nicole & Tom, Raymond's parents, are the hands and feet of Jesus on the land in Kenya. They are volunteering their time and talents to this amazing mission.

One of our newest goals is purchasing more land to plant crops and have live-stock. This will be a huge step towards the project becoming more self-sufficient.

The end goal is to give as many children as possible the opportunity for education. Without an education, the destiny of children in Kenya is bleak. They will never receive the opportunity to go to college and develop a professional career. We hope to CHANGE THEIR DESTINIES through education and by sharing with them the love of Jesus.

While Raymond is the earthly inspiration for this mission, our Savior's love is the heavenly inspiration.
